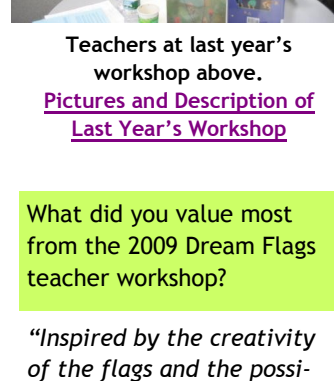

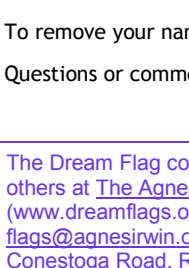
What did you value most from the 2009 Dream Flags teacher workshop?
